SOCIAL STUDIES: 4 credits (Including .5 credit of American Government and Economics)	9 th – World History I * or AP Human Geography 10 th – World History II * or AP World History 11 th – US History * or AP US History 12 th – US Government * and Economics * or AP US Government or AP Microeconomics
WORLD LANGUAGES: 2 credits of same language earned at the high school level (3 years of language is strongly encouraged)	Spanish: Spanish I*, Spanish II*, Spanish III*, Spanish IV Honors, AP Spanish Language, AP Spanish Literature French: French I*, French II*, French III Honors, AP French Language
BIBLE: 4 credits	9 th – Bible 9 10 th – Bible 10 11 th – Bible 11 12 th – Bible 12
PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND HEALTH: 1 credit	Personal Fitness/Health or Female Personal Fitness/ Health or Dance/ Health (may be taken any year of high school)

OTHER ELECTIVES: 1 credit	Any other combination of electives including but not limited to: Public Speaking, Personal Finance, Psychology, Business Courses, or electives from above category. Study Hall is available however no grade or academic credit is awarded.
